LESSON 50: SEALING AND ASSURANCE

Main Idea: The Christian life is one of continually hearing God's Gospel and promises for those who believe in his Son, seeing Jesus as glorious and His work complete, and continually resting on His faithfulness and ability to work out in our lives what he has said he will bring about: the salvation of dead, broken, enemies of God, as we were.

I. How Can We Define Assurance?

"Yet such as truly believe in the Lord Jesus, and love him in sincerity, endeavoring to walk in all good conscience before him, may in this life be <u>certainly assured</u> that they are in a state of grace, and may rejoice in the hope of the glory of God; which hope shall never make them ashamed. 2. This certainty is not a bare conjectural and probable persuasion, grounded upon a fallible hope; but an infallible assurance of faith, founded upon the divine truth of the promises of salvation, the inward evidence of those graces unto which these promises are made, the testimony of the Spirit of adoption witnessing with our spirits that we are the children of God: which Spirit is <u>the earnest</u> of our inheritance, whereby we are sealed to the day of redemption."
